Homework

- It is essential that your child reads at home EVERYDAY
(a variety of texts/genres)
- When your child is reading, make sure to ask them questions about the story to ensure they understand what they are reading.
- Your child will have a reading diary which is checked daily and can also be used as a method of communication between you and the Teacher. Their reading diary will be checked everyday by one of our Teaching assistants.
- Each week your child will have a selection of spellings to practise at home for a test on a Friday. The spellings are given at the beginning of half term.
- Additionally, your children will have a times table test every Friday, this will go home with the spellings.

PE

- The children will be taught PE by both their Class Teacher and our PE specialists, Mrs. Lindsey and Mr. Stevens.
- No jewellery is permitted for PE - please ensure your child removes any jewellery before they come to school.
- For PE children must have a school PE kit, which consists of maroon shorts or jogging bottoms, a blue polo shirt and trainers/pumps. Each child has a school waterproof available in school to ensure that PE can continue in damp weather.
- Children need their PE kit in school every day.

General

- Please encourage your child to get organised the evening before school, e.g. correct uniform, reading diaries etc.
- Full uniform is: shirt, tie, jumper/cardigan, dress/skirt/trousers and black shoes.
- Children are not permitted to bring any items from home into school.
- Children may however bring a water bottle (containing water only).

School Trips

- Our Year Six pupils are incredibly lucky - at the beginning of the year we take the children to Styal Woods, we go on residential to Ghyll Head and have an end of year activity day at Sale Waterpark.
- Next week, all of Year Six are heading to Styal Woods for a 'retreat' where we will take part in an outdoor Worship session and other activities.
